- ✿ Drive 3 miles to Samoa Beach. Have a picnic with beach chairs and umbrella furnished by the Inn. Collect seashells and watch the sunset.
- ✿ Take a walk along the harbor on the Eureka Boardwalk. You may see harbor seals and sea birds, as well as some interesting boats in the Woodley Island Marina.
- ✿ Go boating in our beautiful Victorian Harbor. Kayak, sail, or take a bay tour on the Madaket, the oldest passenger-carrying vessel in continuous service in the US.
- ✿ Visit Eureka's Old Town with its historical buildings, interesting shops, and great places to eat.

- ✿ See redwood trees, monkeys, bears, and exotic birds, at Sequoia Park and zoo, all within a short drive from the Inn.
- ✿ Tour the Blue Ox Millworks to see a demonstration of authentic Victorian tools.

Today the Daly mansion is a beautifully restored bed and breakfast inn that recaptures the charm and elegance of the early 20th century. Located in the Historical District of Eureka, the Inn is within walking distance of Old Town and our beautiful Victorian Seaport on Humboldt Bay.

Garden View Suite

A tasteful return to the Victorian Era, this 3-room suite (bedroom, sitting room and bath) is decorated with English walnut antiques and Victorian reproduction wall coverings and accessories.



Victorian Rose Suite

White wicker furniture and black floral wall coverings and fabrics create a romantic setting in the Victorian Rose Suite. Often used as the Bridal Suite, the Victorian Rose consists of a bedroom, sitting room, and large bath. Maximum capacity: 4 people.



Guest Room

Furnished with turn-of-the-century English bedroom set, including queen bed, dresser, chest of drawers and armoire, this is a charming room with large windows overlooking the surrounding Victorian architecture. Private bath that includes the Daly Mansion's antique claw foot tub.



Annie Murphy's Room

Originally the master bedroom of the Daly home, this room has a fireplace and overlooks the Inn's Victorian garden. The French oak bedroom suite, ornamented with gold ormolu is complete with a gentleman's armoire and a ladies' dressing table. The spacious bathroom is just a few steps outside the room.



Miss Martha's Room

Once the nursery in the Daly home, this cheery room is furnished with French antique twin beds and armoire featuring mother-of-pearl and carved wood inlays. This is the perfect accommodation for the business person who is looking for something more than a hotel room.
